The invitation of the symposium is for each participant to engage with this purpose and leave with a clear personal purpose and set of practices to embody this purpose in their world. About the presenters

Daniel Nepia is a national facilitator for Transition Towns New Zealand and Transition Iwi Actearoa. His academic background is in social anthropology and group depth psychology. Daniel is a creative facilitator certified by Earthcare Education Australia and holds qualifications in adult education and accelerated action learning. He is a permaculture teacher with over ten years experience.

Working from his Auckland base Daniel is currently lead trainer for CadetMax a youth behavioural programme for high risk teenagers from offending and gang backgrounds. He is also the sustainability advisor to Connected Media who recently aired to TV the

documentary "Outlook for Someday" featuring the views of young New Zealand filmakers. Operating his own consultancy he conducts workshops in deep ecology informed by the work of Joanna Macy and leads trainings in household functional landuse design. He is also the national facilitator for the ManKind Project which aims to empower men to live lives of mission in service of the communities we live in

Finn Mackesy is currently the co chair person of Permaculture in New Zealand steering the national executive and guiding the development and spread of permaculture education in Actearoa. After completing his studies in social anthropology in Vancouver he moved to Japan taking a municipal wide training posting as the coordinator of International Relations. Finn gained his qualifications in permaculture design - specializing in sustainable social design in Australia under the tutelage of Robyn Francis of Erda Institute Australasia and Robin Clayfield of Earth Education Australia respectively. He completed P.L.A.N.E.T Organic a practical bioregional development programme in Golden Bay, New Zealand in 2003. He is a permaculture teacher and leads the deep ecology workshops Council of All Beings and The

Work that Reconnects by Joanna Macy.

Today Finn's work crosses over from being a primary school classroom teacher to being at the coal face in his own neighbourhood as a member of the Transition Town Point Chevalier focus group while at the same time leading national workshops for Transition Towns New Zealand and Transition Iwi Actearoa. He recently pioneered and now leads the first ever Permaculture Design Certificate in Auckland through the EcoMatters Trust, Waitakere City's Environment Centre.

Glen Lauder is a master facilitator and change agent who works in New Zealand and globally, and will present the Pachaama Alliance's "Awakening the Dreamer Symposium on Friday evening.

Andrew Morrison is the founder of the Urban Permaculture Leadership Academy based in Wellington, Aotearoa New Zealand and will open the weekend at 6.00pm on Friday evening. * I am writing to tell you my experience of working with Finn Mackesy and Daniel Nepia since I first met them late last year.
