JAPAN'S NEW POLITICAL CRISIS

ON Tuesday it was announced that eighty-two Japanese admirals had "died on active service" in the nine months from March to December. Today it is announced that another half-dozen rear-admirals have been similarly lost to the Navy.

The naval executives, following the same lead, have gone to their deaths as an expiation for their many failures, and though with them has gone much of the accumulated strategic knowledge of the Navy, their "face-saving" annihilation is another grim reminder of the terrific task ahead of the Allies in planning the defeat of the Pacific enemy.

Nor will the new political crisis in Japan help us. It is suggested that Koiso, who took over six months ago, may be ousted by the same forces which sent Tojo from office, the Imperial Rule Assistance Society, an association of political assassins which has planned the murder of half a dozen Prime Ministers.

HEALTH IN N.Z. SHOULD BE IMPROVED NATIONALISTS' PROPOSALS

Rec. 10.30. MELBOURNE, this day. Statistics proved that social security had not improved the national health in New Zealand, and there was increasing need for preventive health measures, said the leader of the New Zealand Parliamentary Opposition, Mr. S. G. Holland.

The weakness in New Zealand's social legislation, Mr. Holland said, was that there was very little provision directed to preventing the necessity for State aid. The expenditure on this was increasing continually. The Labour Government had greatly extended the previously existing social legislation, but unfortunately it appeared to have reached the state of counting its success by the number of patients it was treating in hospitals.

The National party, Mr. Holland said, planned to bring about a state where success would be counted by the number of well people outside hospitals. The party therefore proposed that there should be a considerable extension of the present measures for dealing with the health of the youth of the country, particularly in schools. The schools medical service should be extended so that there would be two complete medical examinations each year, one of which would include X-ray.
